Mt. Pleasant's snow ordinance

Mount Pleasant's ordinance requires public sidewalks to be to be cleared promptly after snowstorms. Chapter 13, Article 4, requires snow and ice to be:

- removed from most public sidewalks 24 hours after the end of the storm
- removed from downtown public sidewalks 12 hours after the end of the storm
- treated so it is not slippery within the same time frames as above
- removed from most public sidewalks 24 hours after being deposited by street clearing crews
- removed from downtown public sidewalks 12 hours after deposited by street clearing crews



If not removed as required, the city may post a notice on the door of the property requiring snow and ice to be removed 24 hours after posting. If snow and ice are not removed/treated 24 hours after posting, the city may remove/treat it or hire a contractor to do the same.

The city will then bill the property owner for the cost plus a \$25 service charge. If the bill is not paid, it will be added to the property taxes. Alternatively, the city can issue a ticket for \$50 plus court cost.

When removing snow and ice, do not block sidewalks or views onto the streets; do not deposit in the street, in the city right-of-way, or neighboring yards' rights-of-way. ("Right-of-way" is the street and typically the area between the sidewalk and the street. If there is no sidewalk, it is a strip along the street about 10ft wide.)

8 Energy-saving tips for winter

- **1.** Switch your ceiling fan's blade rotation to push warm air down to you.
- **2.** Open the curtains of south-facing windows during the day to capture solar heat.

- **4.** Seal leaks around doors and windows and properly insulate to save up to 20% on heating bills while increasing home comfort.
- **5.** Use exhaust fans sparingly so heated air stays indoors.
- **6.** Install a programmable thermostat to save up to 10% on winter heating costs.
- **7.** Clean or change furnace filters regularly. Dirty filters slow down air flow and make your system work harder to keep you warm.
- **8.** Have a professional check out your furnace to make sure it's working correctly and efficiently.
