### 7. Narrative Description

This one-story commercial building was constructed in 1959-60 as a gas station. The original building appears to have been brick, with brick visible on the one remaining exposed wall on the west side. An addition was built on the east side to add a restaurant space in 1975, which was clad in vertical wood siding. The front of the original building and the side addition were then clad in stucco for a unified, modern appearance in 2001. A new red canopy was also added at this time. Thus, the appearance of the building dates from this latter remodel, rather than an earlier period. The front/south of the original building has a glass door entry on the right/east half, with two sets of large windows on the west half. The stucco cladding wraps around the west corner, with brick remaining exposed on the remainder of the west wall. The side of the rear shed-roof addition extends beyond the original west wall. The east side of the original building is mostly obscured by the 1975 side addition. The exposed portion of the original building is also clad in stucco. The east addition was remodeled from a restaurant space into additional convenience store space in 2001, with the door and window on the east side eliminated. It retains four large windows on the south/front of this section of the building. The south/front and south portion of the east side are clad in stucco, with the remainder of the east wall in vertical wood siding. The side of the rear addition has an entry on this side. The current canopy over the two gas pump islands in front of the building was constructed in 1998.

### 8. Narrative Statement of Significance

This gas station does not appear to fall within a potential historic district or be individually eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places based on research and evaluation conducted to date. While the core of the building dates to 1959, it has been remodeled several times since its construction, with its integrity dating to the 2000s. It is located outside of the preliminary boundary for the potential Mount Pleasant Downtown Historic District.

### Developmental history of property

This one-story, commercial building located at 309 West Washington Street was built in 1960. An addition to the original building was constructed at a later date (1980 per the Henry County Assessor).

The 1886 Sanborn fire insurance map does not show this lot. However, the Wiggins House (hotel) was located on this property in the 1870s, per the 1870 Mount Pleasant City Directory. The 1892, 1899 and 1909 Sanborn fire insurance maps each show a hotel on the site. *Mount Pleasant Beautiful* from 1909 has a photograph of the hotel, which was then the Grand Hotel. The Grand Hotel is listed here in city and telephone directories from 1911 to 1923. The 1920 Sanborn fire insurance map shows it as the Grand Hotel, located at the corner of W Washington and S White. The building is a 3-story, square, brick building, 32' in height, with 12' ceilings on each floor. There is an open porch on the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floors of the west portion of the building on the south side, which is also seen in the 1909 photograph. Dick's Hotel is listed here in telephone directories from 1925 to 1939. The 1942 Sanborn fire insurance map shows the original, square, brick footprint of the building remains. There is now a large, 1-story, frame addition to the north. The building is the Homestead Hotel. The Homestead Hotel was listed here

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 Dickey's Prairie Home & Maid-Rite
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telephone directories from 1944 to 1955. An article in the *Mount Pleasant News* (October 29, 1957, page 3) announces "Wrecking Will Start November 1<sup>st</sup>" to demolish the Homestead Hotel."

On 9 October 1957, via warranty deed, Lillian H. and Ralph C. Price sell the S 25' of lot 3 and lot 4 to Tremarco Corporation Incorporated in Delaware (Transfer Book "2", page 3).

An article in the *Mount Pleasant News* on July 1, 1959 (page 6) announces Tremarco Corporation has acquired a supplemental loan "for use in construction and operation of the new local Gulf Oil Station on West Washington Street." *"*Healy Leases Gulf Station" is the headline in April 1960 (*Mount Pleasant News*, April 28, 1960, page 1). John Healy has leased the new Gulf Oil Station on West Washington...The station was built several months ago as part of an expansion program of the company along Highway 34 in Iowa. The Mount Pleasant city directories in 1960 and 1964 show John J. Healy operating Healy's Gulf Service at 309 W Washington.

On 1 December 1964, Tremarco Corporation, a Delaware Corporation, sells the property to Carpenter Oil Incorporated, Delaware Corporation (Transfer Book "2", page 3).

On May 26, 1965, Dick's Superior "400" thanks folks for attending his open house (*Mount Pleasant News*, page 4). Dick's Superior 400, with Richard Halverson, manager, operates a service station at 309 W Washington, per the 1966 Mount Pleasant City Directory. By 1967, the Hallowell Gulf Service is located at this address.

On 30 April 1968, Carpenter Oil Incorporated sells lots 3 and 4 (except the N 55' of lot 3) to Gulf Oil Incorporated (Transfer Book "2", page 3).

In the 1973 Mount Pleasant City Directory, Gulf '7 to 11' Quick Shop is located at 309 W Washington.

On 17 July 1974, Gulf Oil Corporation sells the same lots to Harold Earl Dickey (Transfer Book "2", page 3). A building permit was issued to Dickey Prairie Home in October 1975 to construct a one-story 27'x36' addition on the east side of the building. The contractor was H. Eugene Smith Construction Co. The exterior walls were clad in plywood. This addition created space for Dickey's Dairy Deli, which then became Maid-Rite.

Dickey's Prairie Home and Dickey's Prairie Home & Maid-Rite (Harold Dickey, owner) appear in city directories from the mid-1970s through 2000.

A building permit was issued in July 1998 to Sigourney Oil Company to construct a canopy over gasoline islands. Maid-Rite closed in 2001. A building permit was issued in June 2001 to Sigourney Oil Company (Dave Dickey, president) to remodel the building. Floor plans show the restaurant in the eastern portion. The 2011 city directory lists Dickey's Prairie Home Restaurant here.

In December 2016, Sigourney Oil, Inc sold the building to BDA, LLC. They then sold it in March 2023 to B & B Mt. Pleasant, LLC.

This commercial building is currently occupied by Gasland Express, a gas station and convenience store.



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




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## **Building footprint**
