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7. Narrative Description

This is a one-story brick building constructed as a garage in 1920, with a façade remodel for the local newspaper in 1979. The façade brick and configuration date to the 1979 remodel. A glass door entry is centered on the west half of the building. Narrow tall rectangular windows are spaced to either side of the entry, outlined by projected brick detail. The east half of the building has a pair of similar tall windows and an identical single tall window, each outlined with the same projected brick detail. A flared metal awning extends across most of the façade. The upper portion of the façade is a simple brick wall. Overall, the façade reflects design ideals of the 1970s, with smaller windows for energy savings. The side elevation along the alley reflects the original brick construction from 1920. Several openings have been filled with concrete block. A pedestrian door and a garage door are located along this side.

8. Narrative Statement of Significance

This building appears to be eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing building within the potential Mount Pleasant Downtown Historic District. The building contributes to the historic commercial character of the downtown. The remodeling for the *Mt Pleasant News* in 1979 is one of several façade and building improvements at the end of the 1970s in downtown Mt Pleasant. This work was completed within the preliminary period of significance for the potential historic district, and thus it is considered significant within the history of the potential district. The building retains sufficient integrity to convey its significance as a historic commercial building in a historic district.

Based on research and evaluation conducted to date, this building does not appear to likely be individually eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places at this time. When the 1979 remodel becomes 50 years old, the historic significance of this building related to individual eligibility should be re-evaluated.

Developmental history of property

This one-story, commercial building located at 215 West Monroe Street was built in 1920, with a façade remodel completed for the *Mt Pleasant News* in 1979.

The 1886, 1892, 1899 and 1909 Sanborn fire insurance maps all show a large, 1-story, frame lumber shed on lots 3 and 4, extending to the north from W Monroe. In 1886 and 1892, the address was 104-105 W Monroe and it was the location of the Mt. Pleasant Lumber Company. In 1899 and 1909, the address was 211-213 W Monroe, and it was the location of the M.C. Hall Lumber Yard.

On June 17, 1914, a disastrous fire occurred. It was the "worst blaze in the history of the city". M.C. Hall's Lumber Yard and the nearby Christian Church (to the east) were completely destroyed (*Mount Pleasant Journal*, June 18, 1914, page 1). M.C. Hall rebuilt his lumber company on the northwest quarter of this block, later selling this property along W. Monroe Street.

On 16 July 1920 (recorded 8 February 1921), M.C. Hall and wife sold the E 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot 3 and the E 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot 4 to H.E. Rukgaber for \$2,500 (Transfer Book "1", page 5).

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"Work Started On New Garage" – H.E. Rukgaber has broken ground for his new and strictly modern garage which will be built on West Monroe. The building will be 57x150 feet and one story. Earth removed from the excavations at the garage will be used to fill the lot he has just purchased on E Monroe (*Mount Pleasant Weekly News*, June 2, 1920, page 1). Mr. Rukgaber expects to get into his new garage about the middle of November (*Mount Pleasant Daily News*, October 22, 1920, page 2).

The 1920 Sanborn fire insurance map shows a very large, 1-story building, with brick-faced, tile walls 12' in height. There is a cement floor, steam heat, electric lights and the capacity for 30 cars. The address is 211-213 W Monroe and the building is used for a garage, with a show room in the front/south of the building, facing W Monroe.

Mount Pleasant telephone directories from 1923, 1925, and 1927 show H.E. Rukgaber operating a garage on W Monroe. Rukgaber then built a big garage along W. Washington to the south in 1935, moving to that building. The 1938 Mount Pleasant City Directory shows A.M. Nesbitt occupying the garage. By late 1938, The Fleenor Pontiac agency "will occupy the building now housing the Nesbitt agency, who has been located in the Rukgaber building on West Monroe. The transfers will take place November 1st" (Mount Pleasant News, October 26, 1938, page 1).

The 1942 and 1920 Sanborn fire insurance map shows the same footprint for the building.

On 2 July 1945, Walter L. Rukgaber, et al, sold the E 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot 3 and the E 57 $\frac{1}{2}$ of lot 4 to Roy Fleener for \$19,500 (Transfer Book "1", page 5). Mount Pleasant city directories from 1941 to 1957 show the Fleenor Pontiac Company operating their new car store at 215 W Monroe, with Roy E. Fleenor, owner. They also offered auto accessories and repair. Fleenor also maintained a location on E. Monroe at Adams.

Iris Bowling Lanes announces a grand opening on April 11, 1958 (Mount Pleasant News, April 9, 1958, page 4). Owners Carl Burky and Harold Burky operate the bowling alley until 1960, when the Iris Bowling Lanes business is sold to Ed Poock. "The Burkys (had) operated the Iris Lanes on West Monroe for 2 ½ years. They purchased the building from Roy Fleenor and installed the equipment; later they installed the automatic pin setters making the bowling center fully modern" (Mount Pleasant News, October 22, 1960, page 1). Iris Bowling Lanes/Iris City Bowling is shown in Mount Pleasant city directories at 215 W Monroe from 1960 to 1964.

On 1 July 1965, Carl E. and Irene T. Burky sold the E 57 ½' of lot 3 and the E 57 ½' of lot 4 to Margaret Rogers Patterson and Warren K. Rogers, Sr. (Transfer Book "2", page 5). Iris Lanes (Bowling) has moved and announces a grand opening at their new location, east of the city, near 34 (*Mount Pleasant News*, August 11, 1965, page 8).

"News Now In New Location" – The Mt. Pleasant News moved operations from the location at 211 West Monroe Tuesday morning to the new location, next door west, the former bowling alley location. The move from the location (which has been the home of the News for 37 years) has been in progress for the last couple weeks (*Mount Pleasant News*, September 7, 1965, page 1). On October 30, 1965, "The News" held an Open House at their new 215 W Monroe location. Mount Pleasant city directories from 1966 to 1979 show the Mt. Pleasant News at 215 W Monroe.

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During May 1971, several transactions occurred between Roy and Luella Fleenor and members of the Rogers family (Warren K. & Helen F. Rogers, Sr., Warren K. & Olive K. Rogers, Jr. and Margaret Rogers Patterson) resulting in The Mount Pleasant News, Incorporated owning the E 57 ½ of lot 3 and the E 57 ½ of lot 4 block 4 (Transfer Book "2", page 5).

In 1971, the *Mt Pleasant News* was acquired by Inland Industries, Inc. of Lenexa, Kansas. They later purchased the *Washington Journal* in Washington in January 1987 and the *Fairfield Ledger* in July 1991 ("Fairfield Ledger Purchased," *Mt Pleasant News*, July 3, 1991, 1).

A building permit was issued to Wesley Barton Construction for the Mt Pleasant News on September 5, 1979, for \$35,000 to remodel the façade of the building. A sketch of the building shows the current configuration the front of the building, with a narrow window, entry, narrow window, paired narrow windows, and a narrow window. This was one of the projects completed in 1979 as part of "Operation Pride" that focused on improvements in downtown Mt Pleasant.

City directories from 1980 into the 2010s continue to list the *Mt Pleasant News* at 215 W. Monroe St. They closed this location on December 14, 2018, and moved up the street to 119 W. Monroe on the north side of the square (*Mt Pleasant News*, December 10, 2018, 7).

The News sold the building to Inland Media Company in October 2016, who then sold it to WMPF Group, LLC in November 2016. The building has been owned since October 2018, by Greibahn Properties, LLC, who purchased it from WMPF Group, LLC.

This commercial building located at 215 West Monroe Street is currently occupied in 2024 by Gray Barn Industries, a screen printing and embroidery shop.



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Location map




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Building footprint

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
