7. Narrative Description

This is a one-story commercial building that was completed in 1970. The building was painted gray around 2010, blending the buff brick façade and concrete block construction of the remainder of the building. The building retains its recessed center double entries and paired large display windows. The flat metal awning with "Spurgeon" on the top was replaced by an angled awning around 2010. The concrete block construction is visible on the north elevation, which has two side entries and three sets of paired single-light windows. The south and west elevations are simply concrete block with no openings.

8. Narrative Statement of Significance

Spurgeon's appears to be eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places as a contributing building within the potential Mount Pleasant Downtown Historic District. The building contributes to the historic commercial character of the downtown, constructed in 1968-70 for a business that had operated in the downtown since 1924. The simple style of the building reflects the period of downtown development in the 1960s. The building retains sufficient integrity to convey its significance as a historic commercial building in a historic district.

Based on research and evaluation conducted to date, this building does not appear to likely be individually eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. Assessment of the interior features and modifications would be required for a full evaluation of the individual eligibility of the building.

Developmental history of property

This is a one-story commercial building that was built in 1968-1970 on the site of Presbyterian Church, which was damaged and demolished after a fire in 1965.

The First Presbyterian Church was organized on April 28, 1840, by Rev. Lancelot G. Bell. They built a small wood-frame building on Lot 5 in 1848. In the 1850s, a larger building was needed, so the original wood-frame building was moved to the corner of West Henry and North Jackson in 1856 where it became the first home of the St. Michaels Episcopal Church and later the African Methodist Episcopal Church. It was razed in the 1980s (*Cornerstones*, p. 52). In 1857, a much larger, rectangular, brick building was constructed. This building was badly damaged in the June 1882, including the spire and a portion of the northwest wall (*Portrait and Biographical Album of Henry County* 1888: 670). The 1886 and 1892 Sanborn maps show a rectangular, brick building. Concerns over the foundation of the earlier church resulted in the demolition of the building in spring 1897, with the cornerstone laid for the new church on July 14, 1897 (MPS 1985: 34). The 1899, 1909, 1920, and 1942 Sanborn maps show this new, larger brick church. On December 30, 1965, there was a fire in the church (*Mt Pleasant News*, December 31, 1965, p. 1). The building was badly damaged, and the congregation decided to build a new church at a new location on South Walnut. A demolition permit was issued on March 23, 1966, to demolish the Presbyterian Church on this site.

On June 17, 1968, Lot 5 in Block 7 was sold by the First Presbyterian Church to Robert and Jennie Dunnurk. Construction began for a Spurgeon's department store in 1968. Spurgeon Mercantile Store,

later Spurgeon's, opened a store in Mount Pleasant on April 10, 1924, their 16th store. The original location was 101 West Monroe, on the northeast corner of the square. By 1934, they had expanded into the storefront to the west as well ("Several Merchants in Business Here Over Fifty Years," *Mt Pleasant News*, September 25, 1934, 5). They remained at that location until construction of this new building was complete. During construction, the building collapsed from heavy rains (*Mt Pleasant News*, September 23, 1968, p. 1). Construction was delayed for some time, but the building was completed, and Spurgeon's Department Store announced its grand opening on September 24, 1970. Gary See was the manager of the store, which would continue to offer its clothing, shoes, accessories, and home furnishings from its previous location. Additionally, four new departments would be added: men's wear, boys' wear, full service shoe department, and a beauty salon in the basement under the direction of Mable Pratt. The front of the new building featured two show windows to display the newest in fashions and home furnishings. The store dated its history to the first store that opened in Afton, lowa, in 1907 by Howard F. Spurgeon. The company had grown to 62 stores in lowa, Illinois, Wisconsin, and Minnesota by 1970 ("Spurgeon's Store Extends Welcome for Grand Opening This Thursday," *Mt Pleasant News*, September 23, 1970, 16).

Spurgeon's was listed in the City Directories at 127 N Main in 1972, 1977, and 1985, 1987, and 1993. In 1993, Spurgeon's Mercantile closed several stores in the Mount Pleasant area (*Mt Pleasant News*, July 8, 1993, p. 1).

The 1994 City Directory does not list anything at 127 N Main. In April 1994, the *Mt Pleasant News* reported that a sign had been approved for Maurices, a clothing store, at 127 N Main (April 7, 1994, p. 2). The City Directories in 1995, 1996, 1997, and 1998 list Maurices at 127 N Main.

Jennie M. Dunnurk sold the property to Southeastern Community College (SCC) on July 24, 2000. The college, located in Burlington, opened a Mount Pleasant satellite campus. The City Directories of 2001, 2002, 2003, and 2004 list SCC at 127 N Main. There is no listing for 127 N Main in the 2005 City Directory.

On November 17, 2005, SCC sold Lot 5 to the City of Mount Pleasant. On March 30, 2006, the City of Mount Pleasant sold Lot 5 to the Henry County Agricultural Extension District. The 2006, 2007, and 2008 City Directories list the Extension Service of Henry County and the Henry County Convention and Visitors Bureau at 127 N Main. The 2009 and 2011 City Directories list the Extension Service of Henry County, the Henry County Convention and Visitors Bureau, and Family Connection at 127 N Main. The 2012, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2018 list the Extension Service of Henry County and Family Connection at 127 N Main. In 2022 and 2023, the City Directories list only the Extension Service of Henry County, although Family Connection is still in the building as well.



Location map




